



## **Good morning & welcome to Grace in this time after Pentecost – Ordinary Time.**

The time after Pentecost, often called “Ordinary Time” lasts from Holy Trinity Sunday until mid-November. Even without special festivals, these Sundays are anything but “ordinary”. Then, we are sent out to be Christ’s people in the world. Every Sunday is our greatest feast, with its gathering of the baptized around the risen Christ for word and meal.

**In thanksgiving to God for the saving grace shown to all of us in the death and resurrection of Christ, we celebrate the sacrament of Holy Communion each week. All are welcome at the Table.** We do come forward to the front of the sanctuary for communion. The Pastor stands in the center of the aisle with the bread. Gluten free bread is available – just ask when you come forward. Finally, communion assistants are located on both sides of the sanctuary, with both **wine (red)** and **juice (white)**. Please place your empty cup in the bowl on your way back to your seat after you commune.

**For those participating from home, please have a small glass of wine or juice and a small piece of bread available for all who are planning to commune.** When we come to the Meal portion of the service, and the people who are present in person are coming forward, please eat your bread and drink your cup as you are moved to do so. You may say the words: This is the body of Christ; this is the blood of Christ, as you commune yourself, and/or others.
